Teacher's part

Instructions:

Teacher and student takes turn playing their parts continuously. This helps student develop sight-reading skills while keeping the music going. Teacher can try out various tempo for this piece. Also, teacher can try playing the piece in different ways (e.g. without slurs with syncopated rhythms or with some staccatos added, etc., and student has to try to play his/her part using a similar style to the teacher's.
